# Candlemas: Evensong & Sung Eucharist with Procession

Friday 2 February, 5.30pm & 7pm, Quire


One of the most beautiful feasts of the year, Candlemas looks back at the Christmas season and also forward towards Lent. The Cathedral Choir sings a Festal Evensong at 5.30pm, and then a candlelit procession around the Minster begins our Sung Eucharist at 7pm.

### Ash Wednesday: Sung Eucharist

Wednesday 14 February, 7pm, Quire

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a season of reflection and growth. Our Sung Eucharist at 7pm includes music by Byrd, as well as the traditional practice of 'ashing' – the opportunity to be signed with ash made from last year's Palm Sunday crosses, as a sign of penitence.

### Easter Day Eucharist



Join us for the most joyful day of the year, as we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus with festal Easter music and the Bishop of Southwell and Nottingham's Easter sermon.

**Evensong** takes place every day in the Minster during term time, except on Wednesdays. One of the main features of the service is that most of the parts are sung by the choir, meaning that the congregation is free to sit, to reflect, to pray, to let the music wash over them.

Evensong is sung Minster every Sunday at 3.30pm, and every other day of the week in term time, except Wednesdays, at 5.30pm. Everyone is welcome at every service.






