## **Context & Structure**

Post-Exile: located alongside Haggai & Zechariah – home, but not great...

1:1

1:2-4:3 6 'disputes' – all following the same pattern

Statement Challenge Explanation Implication

4:4-6 The end of the book.

# First Dispute 1:2-5

1:2a Statement "I have loved you"

1:2b Challenge "How?"

1:2c-4 Explanation "I judge Esau/Edom, but not you"

1:5 Implication "You – and everyone – will see I am great"

# Second Dispute 1:6-2:9

- Statement "You priests are disrespecting God" 1:6 1:6 Challenge "How?" 1:7 Statement "You put defiled food on my altar" "How?" (How have we defiled you) 1:7 Challenge "You offer unacceptable sacrifices, and that denies God's greatness" 1:7-14 Explanation They're unworthy of earthly rulers \* It's you, the *priests* who are doing this (and you're the ones who should know best...)
- 2:1-9 Implication "You priests will be cursed"

# **The Six Disputes**

1 (1:2-5)	How God has loved Israel (unlike Edom, they are spared judgement)
2 (1:6-2:9)	Priests are cursed because they dishonour God (with sacrifices and misteaching)
3 (2:10-16)	Broken relationship with God lead to broken relationships among humans (intermarriage, divorce)
4 (2:17-3:5)	The God of justice is coming to refine and judge (which means division)
5 (3:6-12)	The delay in his coming is so that people may repent and be blessed (restored relationship with God explored through e.g. of 'tithe' giving)
6 (3:13-4:3)	Return to the LORD and be blessed.

#### **The Three Pairs**

- 1 God's love for his people and desire that they be spared wrath
  - 2 Improper offerings (sacrifices: what should be a blessing is now a curse)
    - 3 Division/ separation (among humans)
    - 4 Division / separation (which God will bring)
  - 5 Improper offerings (tithes: you curse me, but test me and I'll bless)
- 6 God's love for his people and desire to bless them

# Message of Malachi

#### First three disputes - looking hopeless

2:10 Have we not all one father? Has not one God created us? Why then are we faithless to one another?

Division among God's people comes from not 'remembering' God

(A short detour via Deuteronomy...)

### Second three disputes - interpreting first three, and offering hope

Day of the LORD:

3:1-5 God brings a different kind of division: refiner's fire, fuller's soap

Now between the faithful and the faithless...

...so it is possible to serve God rightly, this delay is the season to repent.

**Israel were always the faithful ones** (opening us up to a multi-racial people of God)
