Mix and match to suit you:

Guided Tours: may be themed—a period of history, stained glass, art etc.

Interview a priest: Discuss matters of belief & faith or explore features, symbolism and ritual of worship. (Can be tailored for GCSE spec).

Faith Practices: Prayer, worship, holy communion or baptism. These sessions explore how Christians worship and express faith in the Minster.

Quiet Time: Engage in group or individual reflective activities.

Visual Arts Programme: Explore the latest exhibition of sculpture, textiles or paintings. We offer bespoke tours and workshops inspired by the style and theme for all age groups.

6th form Conferences: Advertised separately, this is a chance to discuss contemporary topics with a variety of facilitators.

Risk assessment notes are provided, pre-visits welcomed. The Minster is a very safe place to visit. Visits are planned, delivered and organised by Diana Ives (Education Officer), with Matt Hustwayte (Administrator) and our volunteer team. For most visits we invite donations of £5 per student (full day); £4 (half day) to help with costs. The Cathedral subsidises the learning programme.

Subject-Specific Learning

Adaptable for full day, half day or one hour guided tours.

RE: we support delivery of the Nottinghamshire Agreed Syllabus at Key Stages 3&4 and offer bespoke themed study or conference style days for GCSE according to your exam specification.

The Arts: The Minster and its precincts are a wonderful creative stimulus for art & design, music, photography, textiles and creative writing. Options include: sacred music, organ demonstration, poetry, remembrance and an introduction to medieval architecture or stained glass windows.

History: The Minster is a microcosm of English history. We can explore local history, or help you investigate a specific period.

Themed RE Days / Half Days

Sacred Space / Christian Life and Worship: Explore how and why the Minster is a place of public and private remembrance, explore rites of passage and how symbolic objects, actions, words and images are used and help Christians worship and live the Christian life.

Spirituality and Art: Observe and respond to a variety of art from the Anglo Saxons onwards, finding out how they express Christian themes & stories. May include a creative workshop.

Telling the Story: Explore the Christian journey of faith and the Bible as a source of wisdom and authority. Discover the old and New Testament depicted in art and furnishings and ask what the example of Jesus shows about justice, fairness and love.

Big Questions: Explore philosophical questions around faith and belief, the problem of evil, suffering, creation, science and religion.
