Dear Time Travellers,

Hello, my name is Diana, I'm the Education Officer here at the Minster. The staff, volunteers and I have been working hard planning your visit so I hope you are looking forward to it - Time Travelling is one of our favourite weeks of the year. I'm excited to meet you, so please come and say 'hello' if you see me.



People often ask me *'why is it called Time Travelling?'* There are lots of reasons. Let's think first about **TIME**. The Minster is **MEDIEVAL**: the oldest part is over 900 years old. To build it, a **SAXON** church was knocked down. Before that, we think **ROMAN** Gods were worshipped near here. That means that pilgrims have been coming here for A **VERY LONG TIME!** You will soon be the newest pilgrim visitors. Your feet will tread the same path as those 1500 years ago.... **We are all connected in TIME** by the Minster's long history.



Next, **TRAVELLING**. Every pilgrimage is a **JOURNEY** to a place which means something to you (it doesn't have to be a faith building). The Minster is important to all of us in Nottinghamshire because it's our Cathedral - it contains evidence of our county and national history and heritage. You will **TRAVEL** here by bus (most of you), where you'll be met by your **PILGRIM GUIDE** who will make sure you don't get lost on your **JOURNEY OF DISCOVERY** at the Minster on foot. Some people say that life is a pilgrimage, Christians believe that God is with them on their journey from birth to death - the destination is heaven. I hope that helps.

There is one more thing I'd like you to remember - pilgrims come intending to **LEARN**, and you will do 6 activities to help you find out how Christians worship and why we believe in helping others; you'll hear Bible stories and have a good look around the building too, learning about some of the people who work here. We will also spend time together at the start and end of the day to sing and get to know the Minster. Do your best to listen and learn, joining in as much as you can. I hope there is plenty to get you thinking!

When pilgrims leave a special place, it's traditional to take something away as a souvenir. You will make something to keep, and we will give you a **'journal'** to record your journey as a reminder of your day. The Minster is a big, beautiful, building with lots of amazing things to see - from enormous arches to tiny carved mice....like this one.




One of the things people remember about the Minster are the 'peppercots': the two pyramid shaped points on the towers. You'll spot them straight away.
