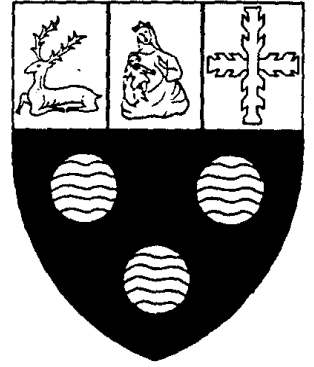

The ancient office of Compline derives its name from a Latin word meaning completion (*completorium*). It is above all a service of quietness before rest at the end of the day, but the simplicity of the service also lends itself to reflection and prayerfulness.

Please do join in at home as you are comfortably able: you may wish to stand, sit and kneel as you normally would in church (we have included instructions for posture in this booklet for this reason), and/or to speak along with the congregational elements of the service.
