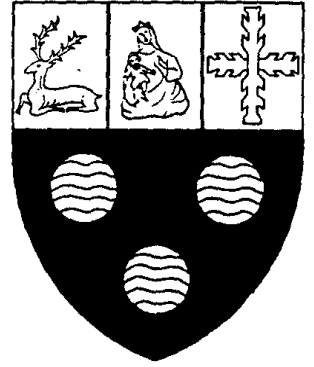

For your future

Framework is a charity delivering housing, health, employment and support services to people with a diverse range of needs. We empower people to achieve social inclusion, financial stability, and independence.

Each year the charity works with more than 18,000 homeless, vulnerable and excluded people across Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, Lincolnshire, North Lincolnshire and South Yorkshire: this includes rough sleepers, people fleeing abuse and domestic violence, people leaving care, prison and the armed services, people fighting alcohol and drug addiction, and people with enduring mental health problems.

Framework's resources include rough sleeper outreach; a wide variety of accommodation; services to prevent homelessness; and treatment, training, volunteering and employment services.

This is an occasion to celebrate the 20th anniversary of Framework and the work done over two decades to support up to 200,000 homeless and vulnerable people. We renew our commitment to support those most vulnerable in our society with a significant new initiative to provide appropriate housing with intensive support to people with the most complex needs, backed by the major Building Better Futures fundraising appeal.

We give thanks for the part played in the life of the charity, particularly in the past year, by many different people – including staff, volunteers, churches and other community groups, donors, business supporters, service commissioners and delivery partners. Above all we celebrate the achievements of our service users.

When Jesus came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

Rebuilding shattered lives

Someone who has been rough sleeping is likely to face many challenging issues. The Opportunity Nottingham (ON) service managed by Framework for people with multiple and complex needs has successfully piloted the Housing First approach. It's a simple idea: give someone their own place and provide bespoke support, care and treatment as they need it.

"Sarah" was leading a normal life when her home was invaded at gunpoint while her daughter slept upstairs. This terrifying experience initiated a spiral of events which led to Sarah spending 14 years between prison, homeless hostel accommodation and rough sleeping.

ON provided Sarah with a 'Housing First' property in 2019. Housed, and with intensive support, she began to rebuild connections with her family, and developed skills to reduce her drug use and become almost completely clean. Last May she was signed off from the probation service.

Framework plans 200 units of accommodation with intensive support in the next five years across Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire, Lincolnshire, North Lincolnshire and Sheffield. We are launching our Building Better Futures appeal this month to raise the £3,000,000 needed to transform the lives of people like Sarah and welcome your support.
