Welcome to Southwell Minster, the Cathedral and parish church of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Please come in and look around! Top Ten Things To See

1 The West Window

Installed in 1996. Designer and artist, Patrick Reyntiens, described it as “a great gathering of angels enjoying being with God, just all joy and worship”.

2 Christus Rex

Created by Peter Eugene Ball in 1987. It is 10 feet tall and weighs 7 cwts.

3 Bread Pews and Mosaic

15th century. Where the poor received bread. The Roman mosaic underneath was probably part of the Anglo-Saxon church.

4 Great War Memorial Window

Designed by Nicholas Mynheer in 2014. A memorial to local men who lost their lives in WWI.

5 Stations of the Cross

14 sculptures made by Jonathan Clarke in 1999. Aluminium on oak.

6 The Light of the World Chapel

A space to forget about the activity of daily life and be still. Anyone can leave requests for prayer.

7 East Window

Created by Jean Chastellain in 1528 for the Temple Church in Paris. The upper windows depict the four Evangelists and are Victorian.

8 The Bishop's Seat

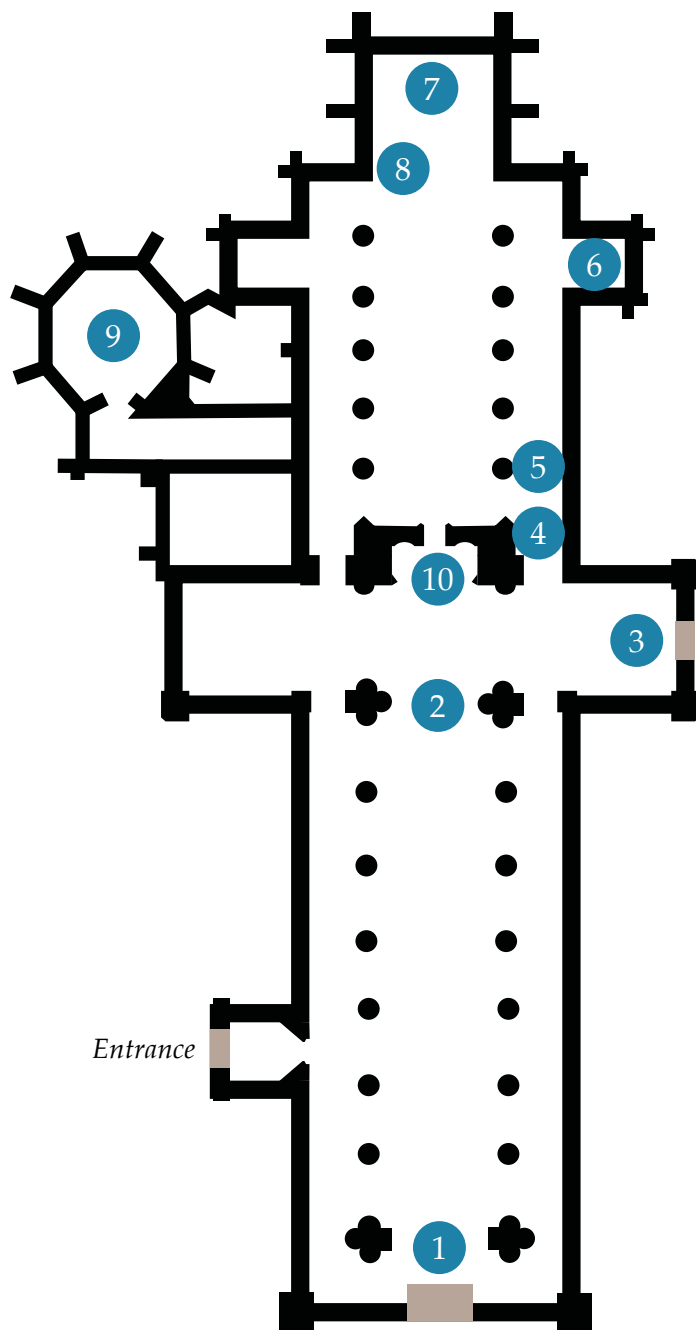
The Bishop's seat (or 'cathedra') has made this a cathedral church since 1884.

9 Chapter House

Built at the end of the 13th century, this is the home of the famous 'Leaves of Southwell'.

10 The Pulpitum

14th century. Decorated with carved figures, ranging from monarchs to workmen.



As you leave the grounds, look back on the exquisite exterior Norman doors on the north, south and west sides. You may also like to visit the Archbishop's Palace and our beautiful Education Garden, which are next to the Minster.



Please feel welcome to stay for services. Evensong is sung most days (except Wednesdays) at 5.30pm and lasts about 40 minutes. This could be the perfect end to your visit.

Sunday worship is at 8am and 10am with Evensong at the earlier time of 3.30pm. Please see our website for variations.

Please do drop by our shop. It is open every day with a selection of cards, gifts, Christian books and CDs of the Cathedral's choirs. A mini shop can also be found at the Welcome Desk.
