The name given to the occupier of the Residentiary Canonry of Sacrista Prebend in Southwell has varied over the years. Canon Missioner is an apt title in 2022 for a new appointment as the Cathedral emerges from the COVID-19 pandemic into a different looking country and church.

From the Revd Paul Rattigan

Although originally from Birmingham, I have lived in various parts of England as an adult — from Norwich in the east, Liverpool in the north and Brighton in the south, as well as Reading, Birmingham and Leicester. Having been active in my church growing up, I lapsed as I went off to university and then rediscovered my faith in my early twenties. I became more actively involved in my church and felt a calling to ordained ministry. During this time I met my wife Anne and began teaching in a sixth form college (Maths and Psychology). We have one daughter, though we have fostered many children over the years. In my early thirties I was recommended for training and then ordained in 1995. I have served as vicar in two parishes; this will be my third cathedral and my fourth diocese. What they all have in common is my passion for evangelism and discipleship. Anne has reinvented herself each time we move, and this is a testament to her patience, perseverance, and talent. Who knows what this chapter will hold for her? THE DECLARATIONS, COLLATION AND INSTALLATION

PRESENTATION OF THE CANON MISSIONER (DESIGNATE)

The Dean presents the Revd Paul Rattigan to the Bishop of Southwell and Nottingham, the Rt Revd Paul Williams, saying:

Right Reverend Father in God, I present the Revd Paul Rattigan to be collated as Canon Missioner and to the Residential Canonry of Sacrista Prebend in this Cathedral Church.

The Canon Missioner (designate) stands before the Bishop.

Bishop Paul, I ask you, in the presence of God and before this congregation, to make the Declaration of Assent.

PREFACE TO THE DECLARATION OF ASSENT *read by the Diocesan Registrar*

The Church of England is part of the one holy catholic and apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care?

DECLARATION OF ASSENT

The Canon Missioner (designate) faces the Bishop and says:

I, Paul Damian Rattigan, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in this faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

OATH OF ALLEGIANCE

The Canon Missioner (designate) faces the congregation, holding a Bible, and says:

I, Paul Damian Rattigan do swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, her heirs and successors according to law: so help me God.

OATH OF CANONICAL OBEDIENCE

The Canon Missioner (designate) faces the Bishop, holding a Bible, and says:

I, Paul Damian Rattigan, do swear by Almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Bishop of Southwell and Nottingham and his successors, in all things lawful and honest: so help me God.

Please sit as the oaths are subscribed by the Canon Missioner (designate).

The Canon Missioner (designate) kneels before the Bishop. Silence is kept as ordained ministers present recall their ordination promises.

A COLLECT FOR VOCATION AND MINISTRY

Bishop God our Father, Lord of all the world,
through your Son you have called us
into the fellowship of your universal Church:
hear our prayer for your faithful people
that in their vocation and ministry
each may be an instrument of your love,
and give to your servant Paul
the needful gifts of grace;
through our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.
Amen.

COLLATION OF THE CANON MISSIONER

The Diocesan Registrar reads the Deed of Collation on behalf of the Bishop, who then delivers it to the Canon Missioner (designate), saying:

Bishop Paul, I collate you as Canon Missioner
and to the Residential Canonry of Sacrista Prebend,
in the name of the Father,
and of the Son
and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen.

Once the Deed of Collation has been signed, the Canon Missioner is vested with his mantle, and kneels once more before the Bishop.

Philippians 1: 18–26

read by the Revd Canon Stephen Hippisley-Cox, Rector of Willoughby-on-the-Wolds, Widmerpool and Wysall with Thorpe-in-the-Glebe, and Area Dean, East Bingham

The second lesson is written in the first chapter of the letter of Paul to the Philippians beginning at the eighteenth verse.

What does it matter? Just this, that Christ is proclaimed in every way, whether out of false motives or true; and in that I rejoice.

Yes, and I will continue to rejoice, for I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will result in my deliverance. It is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be put to shame in any way, but that by my speaking with all boldness, Christ will be exalted now as always in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, living is Christ and dying is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labour for me; and I do not know which I prefer. I am hard pressed between the two: my desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better; but to remain in the flesh is more necessary for you. Since I am convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with all of you for your progress and joy in faith, so that I may share abundantly in your boasting in Christ Jesus when I come to you again.



INSTALLATION IN THE CHAPTER HOUSE

During the organ voluntary, the Dean places the Canon Missioner in his Chapter House seat. She welcomes him into the College of Canons, then invites all members to join her in saying the College Prayer:
