**Conflict Between Church & State: An Audience with King Henry VIII, Saturday 17 June, 7.30pm.** The year is 1542 and the 'King' is engaged upon Royal Progress about his Realm. He reflects upon the events of recent years, which clearly weigh heavily upon him. Newly a widower, following the execution of his fifth wife, Queen Catherine Howard, the King contemplates his actions and their outcomes. The single Act production encompasses the ending of his first marriage, to Aragon, the marriage to Boleyn, the break with Rome, the dissolution of the monasteries, the rebellion in the north and, collectively, the impact upon his Realm and people. The performance runs into a Q&A session which enables audience members to directly question the King; questions which are answered both 'in' and 'out' of character. **Organ Concert by Peter Dyke, Wednesday 21 June, 7.30pm.** Join us for the opening concert in this year's series of evening organ concerts, given by renowned organists from across the country. We are delighted to welcome back Peter Dyke, Assistant Director of Music at Hereford Cathedral, who previously performed here in 2019. In 2005 Peter recorded a series of programmes for BBC Radio 3 exploring J. S. Bach's journey to Lübeck, and so it is a nice coincidence that Peter's programme is all taken from Bach's *Clavier-Übung III*, including the famous *Prelude and Fugue in E flat*, known as the 'St Anne' for the Fugue's uncanny similarity to the hymn tune of 'O God our help in ages past'; this music suits our Nicholson Quire Organ perfectly!
