About the Cathedral Choirs

The musicians at Southwell form a close-knit team, headed by the Rector Chori and the Assistant Director of Music. The Cathedral Choir comprises the Boy Choristers, Girl Choristers and Lay Clerks who, between them, provide music for seven choral services each week during school terms. The Minster Chorale, the Cathedral's adult voluntary choir, is directed by the Assistant Director of Music, and sings regularly for Cathedral services.

The Cathedral Choir takes part in tours, both domestic and international, and has an extensive discography. It has also appeared on radio and television broadcasts both locally and nationally.

Everyone is welcome to hear the choir at Cathedral services; particularly special is the daily Evensong at 5.30pm (3.30pm on Sundays) where the atmosphere of stillness and contemplation is both refreshing and inspiring.
