Patronal Festival, Sunday 28 January. Our Patronal Festival this year is a special one, as we celebrate the 140th anniversary of the Minster becoming a cathedral. Our preacher at the Cathedral Eucharist at 10.00am is the Revd Canon Adrian Daffern, who is the Church of England's Senior Cathedral and Major Churches Officer. Our Festal Evensong at 3.30pm includes a Procession to the Kelham Madonna at the end of the service.

Historic Minster banner at the Patronal Festival. As readers of the Friends' *Pepperpots* magazine will be aware, a historic banner, dating from the early years of the Minster's elevation to Cathedral status in the late nineteenth century, was recently discovered in Trebeck Hall by the Minster Needlework Guild. The banner has been away undergoing conservation at the People's History Museum in Manchester, the costs of which have been generously met by the Friends. It will be returning to Southwell next week, and we will use it in procession at both our Patronal Festival Eucharist and our Festal Evensong on Sunday 28 January. At the Eucharist there will be a short liturgy to welcome the banner back into the Minster.

THE WEEK AHEAD
