PALM SUNDAY (24 MARCH)

8.00am HOLY COMMUNION

A traditional service of Holy Communion for Palm Sunday, from the Book of Common Prayer.

10.00am THE LITURGY OF PALM SUNDAY

Meet us at 10am at Our Lady of Victories on Halam Road as we process to the Minster for our principal service - friendly donkeys will lead the way! The service includes the story of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, as well as the Passion Gospel sung in dramatic form.

3.30pm EVENSONG

Solemn music and readings as we begin our journey through Holy Week.

7.00pm STAINER: THE CRUCIFIXION

Full of beauty and invigorating drama, as well as much-loved Passiontide hymns for all to join in with, John Stainer's famous oratorio *The Crucifixion* is a musical staple of the build-up to Easter for many, and is presented as a devotion at the beginning of Holy Week. The Minster Chorale is joined by soloists Tristan Moore (tenor) and Marcus Farnsworth (bass).

Free entry: this performance forms part of an atmospheric service.

TUESDAY OF HOLY WEEK (26 MARCH)

8.00pm TENEBRAE

A unique, unforgettable service of psalms and readings that marks, and even celebrates, Holy Week's descent into darkness.

MONDAY AND TUESDAY OF HOLY WEEK (25 AND 26 MARCH)

5.30pm EVENSONG

A sparse and reflective service of Evensong, sung by the Cathedral's Choristers.

MONDAY TO THURSDAY OF HOLY WEEK (25- 28 MARCH)

12.15pm HOLY COMMUNION

A simple celebration of the Eucharist.



7.00pm EUCHARIST WITH BLESSING OF OILS AND RENEWAL OF COMMITMENT TO MINISTRY

A very special occasion on which clergy and lay ministers of the diocese gather with the bishops to renew their ministerial vows and bless holy oils to be used in the coming year – all are welcome.

MAUNDY THURSDAY (28 MARCH)

7.00pm THE LITURGY OF MAUNDY THURSDAY

The first of the three major services of the 'Sacred Triduum' (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Liturgy), which take us deep into the mystery of Holy Week. Following a joyful commemoration of the Last Supper, with the washing of feet recalling Jesus doing the same for his disciples, the mood then changes with the dramatic stripping of the altars. The service ends with Watch, waiting with Christ in the Garden of Gethsemane. For those who wish to stay, the Watch continues until 10.00pm.

GOOD FRIDAY (29 MARCH)

10.00-11.30am WALKING THROUGH GOOD FRIDAY

Join the Good Friday family trail around the Minster, meeting characters from the Easter story along the way and finding out what happened on the first Good Friday. With take-away crafts to do at home. The trail will take around 40 minutes.

12.00pm THE THREE HOURS

Sister Carol of the Community of the Holy Name leads us in a series of Good Friday reflections, before our devotions culminate in the Liturgy of Good Friday, beginning at 1.30pm.

1.30pm THE LITURGY OF GOOD FRIDAY

Music, prayers, silence, the solemn singing of the Passion Gospel, and Holy Communion at the foot of the Cross.

5.30pm EVENSONG

The traditional pattern of Evensong provides a space for reflection on the solemn and dramatic events of Good Friday.



EASTER EVE (30 MARCH)

4.30pm EVENSONG

A traditional, though sparse, service of Evensong

8.00pm THE EASTER LITURGY

The lighting of the Easter fire, the proclamation of Easter, the renewal of baptismal vows, and a joyful celebration of Holy Communion in the most liturgically important service of the Christian year.

EASTER DAY (31 MARCH)

8.00am HOLY COMMUNION

An Easter service of Holy Communion from the Book of Common Prayer.

10.00am CATHEDRAL EUCHARIST FOR EASTER DAY

Preacher: The Rt Revd Paul Williams, Bishop of Southwell and Nottingham

Our principal Eucharist for Easter Day, with joyful music, and the Bishop of Southwell and Nottingham's Easter sermon. Following the service, there will be a Blessing of the Easter Garden in the Palace Gardens – and also our ever-popular Easter Egg hunt for children!
