### **SERVICES AND FAITH**

Christian Aid Service in the Minster, Wednesday 8 May, 7.30pm. This year, the Minster is hosting Southwell's annual service for Christian Aid Week. We are delighted to have Ian Hind, a Senior Volunteer Officer with Christian Aid, as our visiting speaker. The theme of the service is 'Burundi — Pushing Back Against Poverty'.
