THE MONTH AHEAD

Helios, until Saturday 15 August. Helios is a new touring artwork by UK artist Luke Jerram. Measuring seven meters in diameter, the artwork features 72dpi detailed imagery of the Sun's surface. At an approximate scale of 1:200 million, each centimeter of the internally lit spherical sculpture represents 2000km of the Sun's surface.

It is very dangerous to look at the Sun directly, so Helios provides a safe opportunity for the public to get up close to, and inspect its extraordinarily detailed surface. The sculpture also features the source of the solar flares which caused the Northern lights to be visible from the UK in May 2024.

Booking online in advance is recommended but not essential, but during busy times those without advance tickets may have to wait and some sessions will inevitably sell out. Tickets on the day may be purchased from The Cathedral Shop (not at the North Door). Last entry, 30 minutes before the end of each day. Dogs on leads welcome.

Feast of St Clare Eucharist, Tuesday 11 August, 12.15pm, Palace Gardens. To celebrate the Feast Day of St Clare, our lunchtime Eucharist will be held in the Archbishop's Palace Gardens. Surrounded by the beauty and peace of nature, this will be an opportunity to remember St Clare of Assisi, one of the first followers of St. Francis and founder of the Order of St Clare religious community in 1212. With music provided by Nick and Vicky Thorpe, there will also be a focus on prayers for peace.

The Okashi Suite - A Japanese Odyssey, Monday 17 August, State Chamber, 7.30pm. Experience the beauty of Japan through the keys of the piano. This unique recital marks the world premiere of the *Okashi Suite*, a collection of original compositions by Ethan Wood. A former head chorister at Southwell Minster and a graduate in music of the University of Huddersfield, Ethan has spent the past year immersed in Japanese culture through the JET program. The suite is a musical travelogue inspired by Ethan's extensive journeys across the archipelago, from the neon-lit streets of Tokyo and the surprising optimism of Hiroshima, to the snowy, volcanic wilderness of Hokkaido and the sub-tropical warmth of Yakushima. Currently living and working in Himi, Ethan captures the spirit of these landscapes and cities. He commissioned a beautiful book of prayers and the psalms, the Luttrell Psalter, described as 'England's most significant medieval manuscript'. On most of its over 600 pages there are scenes of medieval life, beautifully illustrated in the margins. The psalter's significance to musicians is that the book contains images of seventeen different musical instruments, and in this concert you will see and hear all of those different instruments.
